Keynote title:

How would university courses differ if we took the needs of professional practice seriously?

Higher education courses don¹t need to meet the needs of work, but many of them seek to do so. However, they are based around models derived from the academic disciplines. This presentation explores what courses might look like if we attended to the nature of work and the practices that graduates engage in and rethought our courses accordingly.

In order to acknowledge the breadth of its interest in learning within workplaces and university settings the Work Based Learning Network has recently been renamed 'Work & Learning'. The pivotal Network is now celebrating over 20 years of service in higher education and the professional world.

This conference will focus on the constant changing role of work and learning and the opportunities and challenges of sharing current and future practice.





The role of critical reflective practice will also be explored, in

particular to review past 'lessons learnt' and their usefulness to inform and underpin future educational and professional practices.
