What is Articulation?

The SFC definition of articulation is:

Students gaining entry into second year of a degree with a Higher National Certification (HNC) or to third year of a degree using a Higher National Diploma (HND) obtained in a college as an entry qualification.

(SFC 2011a: 7)



Articulation: Proposals for Future Strategy – May 2007

Strategies to progress recommendations from Learning for All

- Colleges/HEIs to work in partnership to develop more effective and joined up routes
- Support mechanisms to ensure smooth transition
- Sharing of good practice in joint course design and college/university partnerships



Importantly!!

 Six HEIs accounted for 87 per cent of articulation in 2005-06

Articulation funding to go to those HEIs where it occurred

 Articulation Hubs established in 2008 – Five Regional Hubs and the Open University Hub



Articulation and Widening Participation

College sector not only increases participation but also widens it

Articulation Policy 2011-13 – Shift in Focus?

- Efficient, flexible learner journeys
- Greater emphasis on cost efficiencies and numbers
- Planned system with guaranteed places
- SFC (2011b) Target 5,500 articulating students in 2015-16
- Introduction of the Additional Places Scheme
